The National PTA is the oldest and largest volunteer association in the United States working exclusively on behalf of children and youth. Since 1897, the National PTA has promoted the education, health and safety of children and families. It was founded by Alice McLellan and Birney and Pheebe Apperson Hearst as the National Congress of Mothers in 1897 in Washington, D.C.

Through consistent hard work, sometimes after decades of perseverance, the dreams of PTA became reality. Child labor laws, public health service, hot lunch programs, a juvenile justice system, and mandatory childhood immunization were accepted as national norms.

Selma Sloan Butler, an educator and mother, founded the National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers in 1926. This organization formally merged with the Congress of Parents and Teachers in 1970.

In 1925, the PTA cooperated with the U.S. Bureau of Education in a Summer Round-Up of Children to help parents identify and correct children's health problems before the children entered first grade.

As conditions changed, so did PTA's programs. The age of the automobile brought new concerns about child safety. The National PTA responded with a safety education program for school children that included the Safety Belt Child Restraint Project and sponsor of Child Safety and Protection Month annually. The program

provides tip sheets for parents and teachers, posters and TV public service announcements.

A world shattered by war in the 1940s sought a new and better way to resolve conflicts before they erupted into violence and destruction. The National PTA was among the very first non-governmental organizations to support the fledgling United Nations and the hope it represented for all children around the globe.

As the years progressed, substance abuse became increasingly common in American culture. During the 1960s the PTA called for schools to focus on the risks involved with abuse. It expanded that idea, and in the 90s, the PTA has devoted a week in March to educating parents and the general public about the dangers of alcohol, drugs, and chemicals to children's health and safety.

Violence on television spurred the PTA to action in the 70s, as it sought to measure the effects of such programming on children. Today the PTA offers critical viewing skills workshops around the country to help parents evaluate what they and their children are watching.

The alarming rise in sexually transmitted diseases and the advent of AIDES found the PTA once more at the forefront of a difficult issue. The PTA advocated that comprehensive information about the disease be made available at school and home to help check the epidemic. It designated programs and publications to help parents talk frankly with their children about the issue.

The PTA has always fostered education of the whole child. In light of that in 1972 the PTA created a cultural arts program called, "Reflections" which, to date, has provided millions of U.S. children with the opportunity to express their emotional and spiritual selves in one of four arts media – literature, music, visual arts, and photography.

The importance of parent involvement in all aspects of a child's life cannot be overstated. In 1994 PTA triumphed with the enactment of the Goals 2000. Educate America legislation, which, among others reforms, calls for local districts to make parents equal partners in their children's education.

PTA's pledge to children is as true today as it was in 1897.

Mission Statement of PTA

- to support and speak on behalf of children and youth in the schools, in the community and before government bodies and other organizations that make decisions affecting children; and
- to assist parents in developing the skills they need to raise and protect their children; and
- to encourage parents and public involvement in the public schools of this nation"

History of PTA in School District 30

"About 50 women gathered in the auditorium of School #30 last Wednesday afternoon for the purpose of forming an organization in the school. The meeting was called to order by Mrs. J.P. Miller (the present Mrs. Blust) who introduced Mrs. Biddulph, pres. of PTA of School #13, who addressed the women. Dist. Supt. Mepham, of Merrick made an address. Mrs. Miller appointed a committee to draw by-laws.

The next meeting will be held on Nov. 19th in the school at 2:30 P.M. at which time the election of officers will take place and a name for the this organization will also be voted upon."

A P.T.A. was formed at School 30 on Wednesday afternoon, November 19, 1924. The Officers elected were Mrs. John Miller, Pres. Mrs. Coates, vice-pres., Mrs. Arthur Hendrickson, Sect., Miss Anna Henningsen, Treas., Mrs. Wm. Faire, Mrs. John Boening and Mrs. Geo. Smith, Trustees. This organization will meet the 2nd Wednesday of each month in the auditorium of School 30."¹⁰






