Preface

Volume XXI Valley Stream Union Free School District Thirty **Closing Exercise Programs**

In New York State students only "graduate" from high school, college and other advanced institutions. The term graduating is a legal term and is not used when completing grammar [elementary] or junior high school. From 1936 till 1940 students advanced to high school, from elementary school, twice a school year in District Thirteen.¹ The minutes of the Joint Boards of Education of the Valley Stream Districts reported the following on "mid year promotion:"

Mr. Sprague from District #13 spoke of the policy of some of the District's having mid-term promotion. Mr. Buck requested Mr. Gross [high school principal] to speak to those present in order that they might receive some idea of the benefits or difficulties of accepting mid-term pupils. Mr. Gross outlined the High School procedure at length and showed that the pupils who entered the High School in February were at a disadvantage throughout their entire High School Course. Many questions were asked and Mr. Buck called for an expression of opinion. Representatives from District #13, #24, and #30 stated that they were in favor of organizing their schools on the half-yearly promotion basis and that they would recommend this procedure at their district Board Meetings.²

On December 19, 1939 the practice of mid-year promotion was discussed in District Thirteen. It was reported that District Twenty-Four had changed to yearly promotion, and District Thirty had always had that policy.

Clear Stream Avenue programs include: 1942, 46 to 51 and 62 to 67. Shaw Avenue School programs include 1951 and 1997. I was unable to locate programs for the ~~Forest Road~~ ~~Shaw Avenue~~ and Washington Avenue Schools.




